

Spotlight Rocky Femia

Just like Peter Martin, I made my way to Texas from upstate New York (via Connecticut where Compaq relocated me from in August 1988. Next time I see Peter, we will have to compare notes about upstate New York.

Compaq hired me in August of '88 after I had been testing their computers for MultiMate (word-processing) / Ashton-Tate for compatibility with our apps before they were released to the market. I accepted an offer from Compaq to be a tester in the network compatibility testing group. I became all-to-aware of the concept of a reorganization day 1. After my orientation, I was picked up by the leader of the OS compatibility group and informed that I was switched (re-org) before I even started. Welcome to corporate America and the first of many re-organizations that I would live through over the next 14 years (until the buyout by HP).

In 2002, I decided to take a nice package and try other things away from corporate America. I picked up golfing and then took a job at Golf Galaxy at Willowbrook (2004) as a part-time employee. Soon the managers asked me to take over as the full-time Sales and Club Fitter, which then led to me getting pushed into management when I took over as the General Store Manager of the Galleria store.

In 2007, I longed for my old way of life with Compaq/HP and came back to HP as a contractor for several "special" projects that came and went until I landed a contract position in the Laptop Security Team as a Project Manager in January 2012. By December of 2012, I was hired back as a regular employee back in with the old group I was hired into back in 1988 (many of the people I worked with were still there).

I spent the next 7+ years working as a Project Manager for a testing group for all the server and storage platforms (we split from HPI to become HPE). In 2019 they moved all our servers and storage to the Taiwan office; and in January of 2020 I was retired.

But always being a glutton for punishment, I have found my way back to HPI as a contractor again (May, 2021 – now) and searching for another "regular" employee position to complete the final lap of working for all of Compaq and HP (HPI & HPE).




You are the hippest of cats – and the most sensitive of composers!
